10 Ungar Building

The Ungar Building is a hub for undergraduate classes and advising for students in marine and atmospheric science programs.

11 Gusman Concert Hall

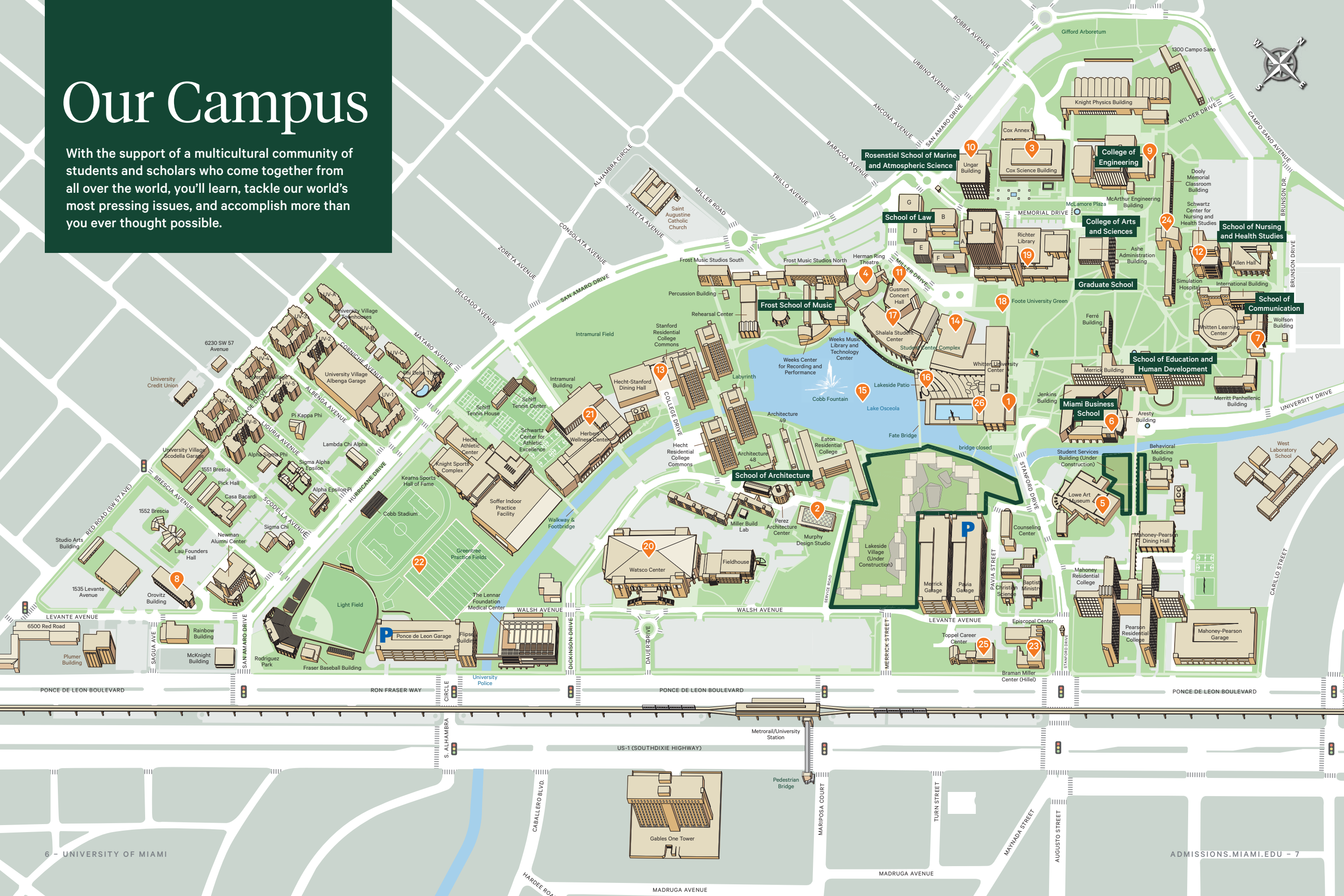

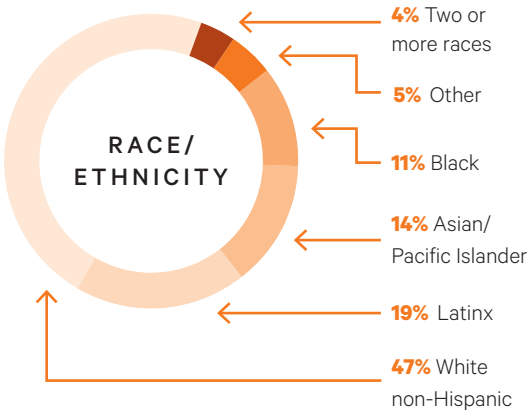

Self-reported test scores will be accepted for admission review. Applicants to the School of Architecture and the Frost School of Music may opt not to submit scores. Architecture applicants not submitting test scores must submit a portfolio. All Frost applicants must complete an audition. Submitting ACT and/or SAT scores is optional for students graduating from a secondary school outside the United States.
